Trainings

The Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD), Food and Dairy Division, and the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Division of Communicable Diseases have scheduled two **virtual** Outbreak-Ready (formerly Epi-Ready) team training opportunities, **September 18 - 19, 2023 & October 17 - 18, 2023.**

Course Description

This two-day Microsoft Teams-based virtual workshop is for public health professionals with responsibility for investigation of foodborne illness outbreaks. Outbreak-Ready uses a team-based approach focused on efficient and effective multi-disciplinary responses to foodborne disease outbreaks. The primary content for the course was created and revised by the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE), nationally coordinated by the National Environmental Health Association (NEHA) and funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Participant Guidelines

This training is focused for public health, health care, and food regulatory professionals with one to four (1-4) years of onthe-job experience involved in outbreak investigations including: environmental health specialists/sanitarians, epidemiologists, infectious disease control staff, public health nurses, laboratorians, emergency preparedness coordinators, and others. The maximum number of participants is 35 per session (maximum two attendees per agency). If you wish for additional attendees from your agency to participate, please indicate this on the interest form and we will contact you if space is available.

Cost

There is no charge for this course.

Technology Requirements

Participants are required to have internet connection, a laptop/desktop computer with a functional microphone and camera, and Microsoft Teams capability.
