Overview of Emmet County Schools



Districts

Harbor Springs, Petoskey, Alanson, Pellston and part of Mackinac City



Broad Enrollment Range across districts

250-2,800 students



Multiple districts have joint superintendent/principal role



Free and reduced lunch rates also vary widely

17%-60%



Emmet County School Health Initiative

- Approached in June of 2017
- Convened initial meeting with:
 - ▶ 3 school superintendents
 - 4 school board members
 - ► Local hospital system
 - ► HDNW staff
- Conclusion of meeting: Is there a NEED for school health services?

Impact: Healthier Students

Healthy students learn better, healthy students graduate

- Programs Awarded
 - ► Empowering Youth Today \$300,000
 - ▶ 218 students in program
 - ► School Based Behavioral Health \$200,000
 - ▶ 224 enrolled Alanson students
 - ► Mindfulness \$11,460
 - ▶ Over 900 students in program
 - ▶ USDA Farm to School \$48,750






Impact - Empowering Youth Today

- ▶Students reported they learned:
 - ▶"about the risks of alcohol, drugs and toxic relationships."
 - ▶-8th grade student
 - ▶"how to make good decisions and how to be safe."
 - ▶-6th grade student
 - ▶"how to respect and be nice to people."
 - ▶-6th grade student
