## Preventive actions to help pre- Berrien County Health Departvent the spread of respiratory ment (BCHD) Finds Possible Bloodborne Pathogen Exposure at a Local Piercing Facility

BCHD has identified unsafe and unsanitary piercing practices at a local body art facility, Paparazzi Tattoo & Body Piercing located in Niles, Michigan, that may have exposed former customers to the blood of other customers. BCHD has currently suspended the operating license for Paparazzi Tattoo & Body Piercing. As a precaution, customers who have ever received body piercings of their navel (belly button), tongue, nipples, genitals, and/or other surface or dermal piercings though February 2020 are recommended to receive blood tests for hepatitis B, hepatitis C, and HIV.

Individuals seeking testing are encouraged to visit their healthcare provider, but are also able to get tested at the Berrien County Health Department offices in Niles on Tuesdays and Thursdays or the Benton Harbor office on Mondays or Thursdays, if they do not have a primary care provider.
