43% of controls always/often avoided crowded places/events





## **SUMMARY**

- Most individuals (80.5%) are testing as a result of symptoms. 36.3% tested as a result of close contact.
- 32.9% used PCR, 23.7% used rapid testing to confirm positive COVID case, 43.3% did both.
- 20.8% had tested positive before.
