Unique in the nation, the Michigan Association for Local Public Health (MALPH) was founded in 1985 as a private, non-profit, 501(c) 3 state association to strengthen Michigan's system of local public health departments and local governing boards. It provides for the exchange of information while representing all of Michigan's 45 city, county, and district health departments to the state and federal legislative and executive branches of government. It is recognized as the legislative and policy advocate for Michigan's local public health jurisdictions.
