- 1. Call to Order: Meeting called to order by Andrew Cox at 9:31 AM.
- 2. **Approval of Agenda**: Motion to approve agenda with one addition (PFAS notification to Residents) by George Friday, support Sara Simmonds. Motion carried.

- 4. Officer & Affiliate Reports

- a) President's Report: Placed on file and provided in an email to the forum.
- b) Treasurer's Report: Motion by Chris Klawuhn, support by Sara Simmonds to approve the report. Motion carried.
- c) MALPH Report: Norm Hess. HB4049 was opposed by MALPH and vetoed by the Governor; this is the bill that gives authority to LHD's not MDHHS to close schools under emergency epidemic orders. A water shutoff bill and pesticide bill may be moving, let Norm know if you want him to follow these. June 14<sup>th</sup> is the Michigan Health Policy Forum and MALPH will be represented. Save the Date coming for MDARD-MALPH Communications Trainings. MI Premier Public Health Conference call for abstracts deadline will be extended past March 26<sup>th</sup>, EH presentations would be welcomed.
- d) MEHA Report: Tanya Rule. Application for scholarships for MEHA members to attend virtual NEHA is open, a short window to apply.

# 5. State Department Reports:

- a. EGLE: Dana DeBruyn: Upcoming webinar trainings for the non-community water supply operators on April 22 & 23. Onsite Wastewater Admin Rules webinar will be held on April 28 and part 2 on May 5<sup>th</sup>. Dana will resend the survey to LHD's that did not respond and provided a general email box for future communications from EGLE and also the Suggested Practice Guidelines for Submitting paperwork to EGLE. Past questions that have come up at roundtable events regarding MiEdwis and contracts will be reviewed. Finalizing the work needed on Well Classifications. The Drinking Water Lab is requesting that any LHD's that have excess Styrofoam mailers/ ice packs kits to make arrangements with them to return them to the lab. Have been able to back fill some positions and expanding other teams. Non-Community have filled 2 lower peninsula positions and 1 engineer in the UP. Pool Program position previously held by Teresa Fry has been filled by Starla. A new data application position as part of a new unit housed in EH filled by Rhonda Du Page Matt Gamble: Private Type III evalutation is paused and no self assessment is needed. For 2021 all corrective action plans will continue, discuss with your consultant. Jeremy Hough: Pool program has issued 3000 licenses and 1200 hold letters via the emails provided at licensing. All LHD Fee payment reports have gone out some will be resent with adjustments. Dan Dettweiler: Non Community Staff Coverage Maps will shift with the two new hires. Self Assessment for 2020 are being worked by LHD staff. Ian Smith discussed PFAS tracking and monitoring for non transient type II supplies, 75% of samples are accounted for and likely private lab results are out there just not entered yet by EGLE. There has been less than 1% detects with some above the MCL. Since LHD Type II programs need to track PFAS samples, updated to Watertrack are close with EGLE testing product in house and doing QA on it. There will be a guidance/webinar on reviewing PFAS lab reports and watertrack enhancements coming soon. Rejection of some lab reports from private labs may require resampling to determine future annual/quarterly status. EGLE state that there is no stream of additional funding for PFAS non community work that LHDs are required to complete in this program.
- b. MDARD. Sean Dunleavy and Tim Slawinski: Licenses should have been received by all LHD's.
- c. MDHHS. Accreditation remains paused.
- d. **LARA.** Visitation order has been updated so State and Federal Guidance for nursing home visitation is consistent. If there is any interest in this group for LARA presenting information regarding their organization, Larry Horvath is willing to present to the group.

- 8. **New Business**: PFAS Notification to Residents. Recent EGLE investigation in Grand Traverse County followed MPART protocol. There was an 8 months delay in conducting sampling and also a timing delay in notifying public of the upcoming sampling event. At a recent MPART Citizen Advisory Group meeting there was discussion of notifying residents when investigation begin if there is a high probability of impacted drinking water wells. Consider informing the community ahead of sampling event that residents can decide that they may want to consider alternative water source until data is available to determine impacted drinking water well. LHD's need to advocate that PFAS investigations should be a team effort to include EGLE, MDHHS and LHD.
