General Responsibilities

- Under general supervision and in collaboration with the Community Health Division and Health Education team, this position will support community engagement to promote healthy lifestyles around topics including but not limited to: chronic disease prevention, tobacco cessation, diabetes prevention, nutrition, physical activity, and other general health/wellness topics as appropriate.
- Responsible for program planning, implementation, and evaluation with a variety of age groups and demographics, including 1:1 direct service and/or group/classroom education.
- Some program data entry required using various software applications including Electronic Health Record.
- Programming includes evidence-based community education and outreach specific to chronic disease and general health education outreach and programming on a variety of health topics.

Minimum Requirements

- Bachelor's Degree in Health education or public health related degree.
- Certified Health Education Specialist (CHES) credential preferred.
